Telecom registers record growth during the year 2005

>	More than 30 million telephony subscribers added during
	2005, total base nears 125 million.

- **Gross additions around 5 millions in December, 2005.**
- Tele-density reaches 11.43.
- Internet subscriber base achieves the Broadband Policy target of 6 million
- Broadband target falls short of policy.

The subscriber base for telephony services accelerated its growth pattern during December, 2005. In the month of December 2005, a record 4.92 million subscribers were added as compared to 3.79 million subscribers in November 2005. With the ongoing upward trend, total 31.97 millions subscribers have been added during the year 2005.

During the year 2005 the telephony subscriber base achieved the following rate of growth:

Mobile Service

For mobile segment 4.46 million subscribers have been added during December 2005 as compared to 3.51 million in November 2005. The mobile additions consist of 3.19 million GSM subscribers and 1.27 million CDMA subscribers as against 2.33 million GSM and 1.18 million CDMA last month.

During the year 2005 about 27.91 million mobile subscribers were added, making it a total of 75.92 million mobile subscribers at the end of year 2005.

Fixed Service

In the fixed segment, a total of 0.46 million subscribers were added during December 2005, which were predominantly WLL (F). With this the total subscriber base of fixed lines have reached 48.93 million. During the year 2005 about 4 million fixed subscribers were added, as compared to 2.67 millions added during 2004.

Tele-density

The gross subscribers' base consisting of fixed as well as mobile has touched 124.85 million at the end of December, 2005 as compared to subscriber base of 92.88 million at the end of December,2004, thus registering an overall annual growth of 34.42%.

The year 2005 ended up with the tele-density reaching 11.43 as compared to 8.62 at the end of 2004.

4. Internet Services & Broadband Growth: -

During the year 2005 Internet subscriber base crossed the Broadband Policy target of 60 Lakh. Broadband connections have fallen short of the target. At the end of December, 2005, total Broadband connections in the country have crossed 8.35 lakhs only as against a target of 30 lakhs in Broadband Policy-2004.
